



## HERITAGE PINOT NOIR TASTING

### BUTCHER'S HILL 'ORONSAY' PINOT NOIR

\$125 / \$106.25

The only Heritage Range wine currently produced from the Butcher's Hill vineyard. The 'Oronsay' wines are produced with high portions of Whole Bunch fermentation and select barrel usage to truly represent the terroir of the vineyards and the influence of that specific season.

#### TASTING NOTES

Savour the delicate aromas of red currant and sour cherry in this Pinot Noir, intertwined with subtle notes of fennel frond and vanilla. The palate offers a graceful expression of rose petal and espresso coffee, combined with rich dark chocolate and lightly confectioned raspberry. It's soft, integrated tannins and refreshing acidity create a harmonious texture, culminating in a long and nuanced finish. This wine is an elegant reflection of its terroir.



### COOINDA VALE 'ORONSAY' PINOT NOIR

\$125 / \$106.25

Named for the 'R.M.S. Oronsay' which brought the Pooley Family out from the UK in 1952, these wines are produced to show a true sense of place and as a tribute to where we come from.

#### TASTING NOTES

This Pinot Noir opens with savoury aromas of white pepper and black licorice, lifted by a hint of rose petal. The palate is elegant and lively, showcasing a delicate interplay of damp earth and green herbaceous qualities alongside bitter orange and rosemary. Rich tannins provide structure, leading to a clean and persistent finish. It's a beautifully balanced wine that perfectly captures the cool-climate character of Tasmanian Pinot Noir.



### JACK DENIS POOLEY PINOT NOIR

\$195 / \$165.75

Named for Jack 'Denis' Pooley, passionate Pinot Noir consumer and founding member of the Hobart chapter of the Beefsteak & Burgundy Club. Jack was a driven businessman with a passion for perfection

#### TASTING NOTES

The flagship of Pooley Wines, a Pinot Noir of aromatic intensity and bold tannin structure. Displaying delicate aromas of vanilla, dried herbs, macerated cherries and bitter orange, the palate opens with a burst of juniper, blood orange, and kumquat, underpinned by cranberry, mulberry, and savoury preserved meat. This is a Pinot Noir defined by its architectural integrity. The persistent acidity and firm tannins suggest a wine that will evolve gracefully over the next decade, rewarding those with the patience to cellar it.
